Definitions

Personality and character are two sides of the same coin. Personality is given. Character is formed.

PERSONALITY

- Personality is the basic building block of who we are, and is focused around preferences.
- Our personality is 'value neutral'. One type of personality isn't 'better' than another, just different.
- Our personality can be polished like a pearl, but not changed very much. Therefore the key is growing self-awareness (maturity) which helps us understand our preferences and how they affect others.

CHARACTER

- Character is the aggregate of the distinctive qualities characteristic of an individual.
- Character contains a value judgement; you can be a person of good or bad character.
- As Christians we believe God wants to grow us in Christ-like character, in qualities such as godliness, integrity, humility, servant-heartedness.
- With character we need to be humble about our strengths and prayerful about our weaknesses, allowing Christ to transform us.
- Character will always reveal itself: in the small things; when under pressure; when in private.
