Rebecca is fed up. Her boss seems to have it in for her. No matter what she does, how hard she works, how careful she is, she always gets criticised. When she started the job she was certain that this was where God wanted her. Now, two years on, she isn't so sure. How can Rebecca respond to this ongoing situation in a way which grows Christ-like character?

Simon can't believe he's 'fallen' again. He'd done so well over the last six months, and now he feels he's back to the starting blocks all over again. What makes it worse is that he despises himself for it, he hates this part of his character that does not seem able to control his addiction to pornography. How can Simon respond to this ongoing issue in a way which grows Christ-like character?
